HTAV Peer Mentoring Program

Participate as a Mentor

HTAV strives to improve the quality of History teaching and support its members to flourish through professional learning, networking and peer mentoring. With this in mind, the **HTAV Peer Mentoring Program** aims to bring together History teachers at all levels in their professional careers to create a community of support and expertise.

What is the Peer Mentoring Program?

The program enables History teachers to meet, talk and share experiences in a casual setting. Mentors offer 6–8 hours of support throughout the year at times that suit you both. Mentoring can be a coffee meeting, Zoom, drinks after a conference, email or phone call. Your mentee may prefer to use the 6–8 hours of support during a critical time or spread out through the year. Offers of assistance beyond the 6–8 hours are not expected but can be negotiated privately between the mentor and mentee.

Applications for the program will be accepted during Term 1 with mentors paired with their mentees in Term 2, or when an appropriate mentee is available. Throughout the year, HTAV will seek feedback on both mentee and mentor experiences. Mentors will receive a certificate to use as evidence for Australian Professional Standards for Teachers, Standard 7: Engage with Professional Teaching Networks.

We all seek advice from others in some capacity – a question in the staffroom, a chat at a conference or tossing a question to a social media group. Joining as a mentor facilitates these conversations, allowing you to gain valuable insight into your own History teaching practice, reinvigorate your teaching skills, broaden your professional network and make a difference in the lives of other History teachers. It is a great reminder of your professional and personal growth and allows you to share what you know.

Please don't let concerns that 'I'm not an expert' prevent you from becoming a mentor. Even a few years of teaching or leadership is a wealth of experience for someone starting out.

Guidelines

Mentors can provide encouragement and support. Mentees can seek general advice on developing appropriate assessment tasks, delivering course content, planning their year and helping students prepare for assessment tasks.

Here are some examples of questions you may have from your mentee:

Can you please check my SAC? I'm not sure if it meets requirements.

How can I differentiate my content delivery for students looking to stretch their capacities or who are struggling?

What are the best sources to improve my own content knowledge?

How can I help my students prepare for SACS and exams?

I feel overwhelmed by work demands. What advice can you give me?

Mentors are not expected to:

- take responsibility for a mentee's class
- be available on call
- observe a mentee's teaching
- create SACS for a mentee
- know a mentee's school VCE policy
- cross mark SACS (unless you offer and a formal arrangement is established)
- share lesson plans and classroom resources unless you choose to do so to illustrate a particular approach or skill.
