Stories create an immediacy for students by providing vivid ways of representing the past but work best when they provide deeper meaning as well. Vividness and meaning is vital to teaching history well in a world awash with stories. I will reveal how the Historian E P Thompson and the Anthropologist Clifford Geertz used stories to show deeper meanings in their subjects. I will also tell my own 'thick description' story about Jack Johnson who boxed/performed in Australia in the Age of Race.
