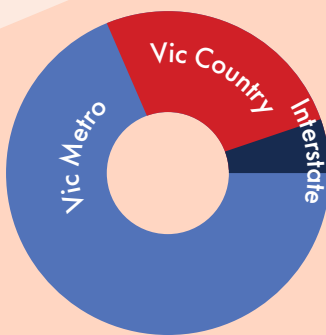


2025 Year in Review

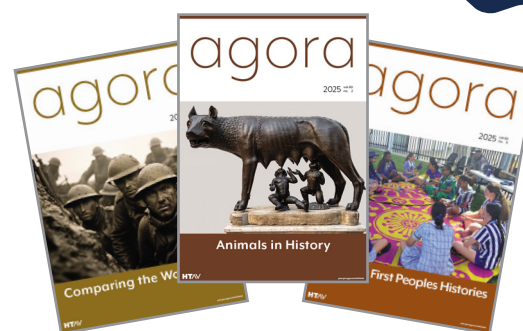
